IAU WORLD CROSSBOW CHAMPIONSHIP - AVON 2010 REVIEW

The 15th IAU World Crossbow Championship took place in Avon, France on August 31 to September 4. All three international crossbow archery disciplines were staged on a single site at the Vulainessur-Seine sports complex in superb late summer sunshine. Crossbow archers from 15 countries contested the team and individual championship events which were scheduled over five days of shooting; 11 out of the 15 participating countries won medals during the World Championship in Avon.

The 2010 Individual IAU World Champions are Simon Beyeler SUI (Open 30 meter Match-crossbow), Claude-Alain Delley SUI (U21 30 meter Match-crossbow), Sergey Kamenski RUS (Men 10 meter Match-crossbow), Sandra Tauber GER (Women 10 meter Match-crossbow), Mickael D'Hallum FRA (U21 Men 10 meter Match-crossbow), Auréile Chevance FRA (U21 Women Match-crossbow), Domagoj Pereglin CRO (Men Field-crossbow), Ina Schmidt GER (Women Field-crossbow), Jacques Mangematin FRA (U21 Junior Field-crossbow), Valentina Pereglin CRO (U18 Cadet Field-crossbow) and Vladimir Kuts RUS (Senior Field-crossbow).

In the Teams World Championship there were wins for **Switzerland** (30 meter Open Class and 10 meter Women), **Germany** (10 meter Men, 10 meter U21 Men and Field Men), **France** (10 meter U21 Women, Field U21 Junior and Field Senior) and **Croatia** (Field Women and Field U18 Cadet).

10m MATCH CROSSBOW MEN FINAL: Russia's Sergey Kamenski (photo left) is congratulated on becoming the new World Champion. He qualified for the final with 593 points and won the title with 691 points. Defending World Champion and 50m Rifle Gold Medallist at the 2010 ISSF World Championships in Munich, Peter Sidi (Hungary) placed 2nd with a score of 689 points. Germany's Norbert Ettner was 3rd with a total of 683 points.

10m MATCH CROSSBOW WOMEN FINAL: Sandra Tauber, Germany, won the Women's world title with a score of 490 points. The second qualifier behind Austria's **Franzika Peer,** Sandra overtook Franzika in the 10-shot Final. After a shoot-off Switzerland's **Silvia Guignard-Schnyder** won the Silver medal with a disappointed Franzika having to settle for the Bronze medal after scoring an 8 with her final shot.

10m MATCH CROSSBOW U21 MEN FINAL: Mickael D'Hallun, France, became World Junior Champion with a total of 487 points. Second after qualifying, 2 points behind German **Manuel Wittmann**, Mickael shot the highest score during the final (97 points) to take the Gold medal. Wittmann won the Silver medal with his German team-mate **Stephan Reichhuber** joining him on the podium in the Bronze medal position.

10m MATCH CROSSBOW U21 WOMEN FINAL: The French squad completed the double of Junior 10m World Titles with a win for Aurélie Chavance in the girls event. In fact, it was a clean-sweep for the French with Aurélie 483 points being joined on the podium by her team-mates Lena Giannini 483 points (Silver) and Mary Roy 480 points (Bronze).

30 m MATCH CROSSBOW TEAM: The Swiss Team are 30m Open Class World Champions with **Simon Beyeler, Beat Müller** and **Irene Beyeler.** The three archers finished with a total of 1694 points, one point ahead of the Austrian trio of **Franzika Peer, Markus Bichler** and **Thoma Lampl.** Team Germany took the Bronze medals with **Thomas Aumann, Hermann Plötz** and **Oliver Maier** on 1671 points.

FIELD CROSSBOW MEN FINAL: Croatia's Domagoj Pereglin became World Champion with a score of 1805 points (1712+93) ahead of Pascal Christoffel, France and Feng Tseng Chin, Chinese Taipie. Two days earlier, the Men's Team title had gone to Germany in a close contest with Croatia (Silver) and France (Bronze); just three points separating the three teams o the winners podium.

FIELD CROSSBOW WOMEN FINAL: After dominating the qualifying rounds, Germany's Ina Schmidt (photo) successfully defended her '08 World title by adding to her 38 point-lead in the 50m Finals on Saturday September 4. Branka Pereglin of Croatia added a Silver medal to her children's Gold medals in the Men's and Junior's categories, while the only French representative in the category, Melanie Regniez won the Bronze medal.

FIELD CROSSBOW JUNIORS FINAL: Jacques Mangematin (photo) won the Junior U21 World Title for France with a score of 1789 points. The Silver medal when to the Russian Artem Naumenko and the Bronze medal went to the '08 Junior World Champion Florent Guillaume of France.

FIELD CROSSBOW CADETS FINAL: Fresh from her experiences in the Air Pistol event at the Inaugural Youth Olympic Games in Singapore, 16 year-old Croatian **Valentina Pereglin** won the Junior World Title in Avon. Placed 2nd before the 50m Final Valentina overcame a 9 point deficit to her compatriot **Marijan Kajfes** who took the Silver medal. The Bronze medal went to France's **Anthony Segur** who scored a perfect 100 point maximum in the 10 shot final.

FIELD CROSSBOW SENIOR FINAL: Archers from 10 countries contested the over 55's World Championship. Russia's **Vladimir Kuts** won the Title with 1726 points (1630+96), in the Silver medal position **Istvan Matrai**, Hungary scored 1721 points (1627+94). Estonian **Aleksander Karama** finished in the Bronze medal position with 1717 points (1627+90).

30m MATCH CROSSBOW U21 FINAL: Switzerland's **Claude-Alain Delly** won three medals; Bronze (Standing), Gold (Kneeling) and Gold in the Combined event with a total score of 663 points (570+90 Final). The Silver and Bronze medals in the Combined event went to Germany's **Stephan Reichhuber** 660 (565+95) and Switzerland's **Adrain Fuchs** 650 (556+94) respectively.

30m MATCH CROSSBOW OPEN CLASS FINAL: Reigning 30m Open Class World Champion **Simon Beyeler**, Switzerland successfully defended his title in Avon. With a score of 97 points in the Final he finished with 673 points to beat team-**mate Silvia Guignard-Schnyder** who won the Silver medal. She finished with 667 points. The Russian **Sergy Kamenski** completed the podium. He won the Bronze medal following a three-way shootoff with Swiss archers **Beat Müller** and **Monika Zand**.
